

- Discernment



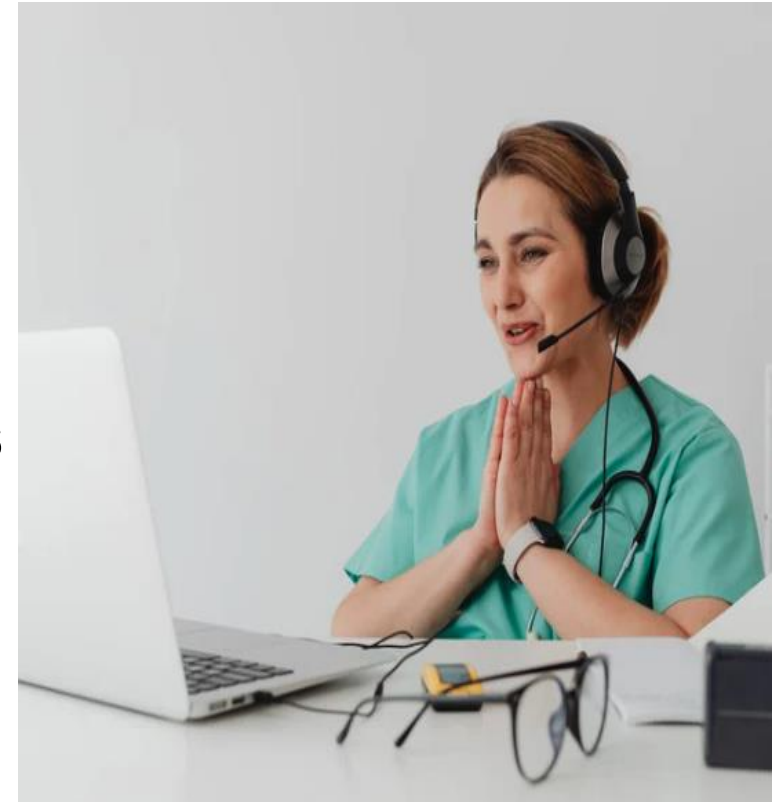
Elements of Caring

Limitations of AI



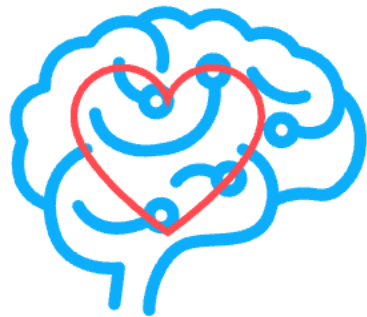
“Machines can mimic tone, analyze sentiments, and generate responses, but they cannot choose compassion, they cannot listen between the lines or pause to make space for silence.”
